

The Society of the Cincinnati, founded in 1783, is a nonprofit historical and educational organization that promotes public interest in the American Revolution through its library and museum collections, exhibitions, programs, research and publications, and other activities. Since 1938 the Society's headquarters, museum and library have been located at Anderson House, a 1905 Beaux-Arts mansion and National Historic Landmark in Washington, D.C. Anderson House is located at 2118 Massachusetts Avenue, NW, in the Dupont Circle neighborhood. The museum is open Tuesday through Saturday from 1:00 to 4:00 p.m. Admission is free.
